Mr. Labriola's role as Commander of AVIP is appreciated, and plays a positive and stabilizing role in at MCI-Shirley; which demonstrates his rehabilitation and ability to perform as a productive law abiding citizen. He is a wheelchair bound Veteran, who has made numerous contributions to the quality of life for inmates across race and cultures. He is a human being who I am proud to acknowledge as a friend; even though I only met him in recent years.

Joseph Labriola served two years of duty in Vietnam; he has used his military training and experience as an attribute to work with other inmates in order to organize for positive changes in DOC. I am particularly impressed with the manner which he has used his leadership skills, working with a number of inmate organizations, most importantly, the manner in which he fought back racial divisions and homophobic beliefs.
